ROCHELLE POLICE DEPARTMENT:

Our primary goal is to continue to make the City of Rochelle a safer place to live and work, and to provide high quality professional service. We encourage community partnerships, protect the safety and well-being of our citizens, and take a proactive stance through crime prevention programs.

Rochelle "The Hub-City" is a growing community of 9,500 plus citizens and is a natural transportation hub for industry and commercial business. Two interstate highways and two major railroads intersect in Rochelle bringing additional activity to the area. Our airport, hospital, and travel stops also provide services to both local residents and travelers.

The Police Department provides full police services to the community 24 hours a day and in 2018 was comprised of 19 sworn officers, one K-9 unit, eight civilian personnel, and six crossing guards. The dispatch center serves the citizens of Rochelle with full enhanced 911 services and also serves as a back up dispatch center for the Ogle County Sheriff's Department.



CHIEF ERIC HIGBY

Chief Higby joined the Department in 1996 and has spent time in both patrol and investigations divisions. He was appointed chief on September 25, 2009. He holds a Bachelor's Degree in Law Enforcement Administration and is responsible for the day-to-day operations of the Department. Chief Higby is a graduate of Northwestern University's School of Police Staff and Command. In 2008, he attended ten weeks of training at the 234th session of the F.B.I. National Academy in Quantico, Virginia. Chief Higby has recently received training in Freedom of Information, School Violence and Media Relations.

DEPUTY CHIEF**

Deputy Chief Leininger joined the department in 1998. He served as Detective Sergeant for the last 12 years, before being promoted to Deputy Chief on 01/22/18. He is in charge of the evidence room and is responsible for transporting evidence to and from the Illinois State Police crime lab. He also assists with the department's Facebook page and serves as the department's photographer. Deputy Chief Leininger has received specialized training in sex offender registration, homicide investigations, gang crime, and serves as President of the Ogle County Crime Stoppers board. 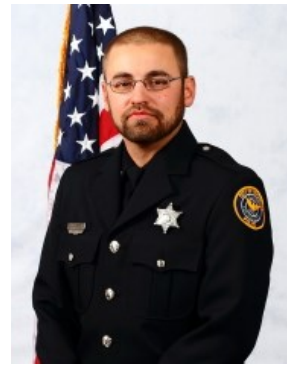
JOHN KALTENBACH

OFFICER

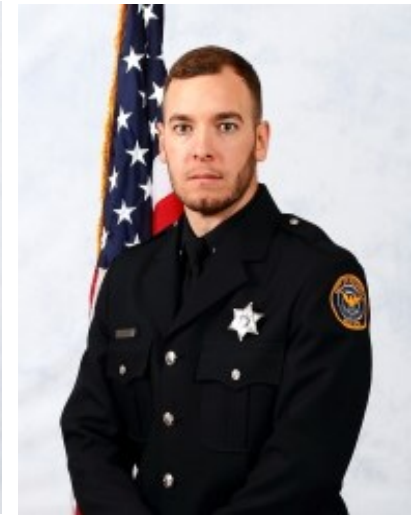

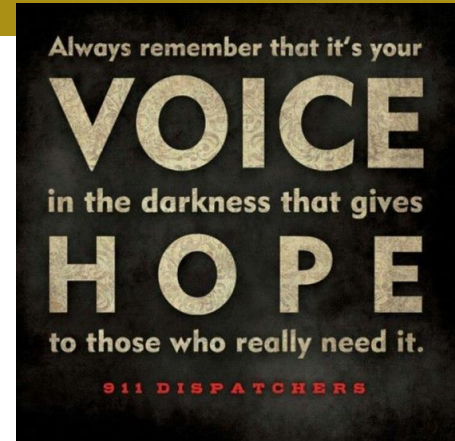

Two hundred and forty-nine law enforcement officers graduated today from the FBI National Academy Program at Quantico, Virginia. The 274th Session of the National Academy consisted of men and women from all 50 states. Included in the class are members of law enforcement agencies from the District of Columbia, 23 international countries, five military organizations, and seven federal civilian organizations.

Internationally known for its academic excellence, the National Academy Program, held at the FBI Academy, offers eleven weeks of advanced communication, leadership, and fitness training for selected officers having proven records as professionals within their agencies. On average, these officers have 21 years of law enforcement experience and usually return to their agencies to serve in executive-level positions.

FBI Director Christopher Asher Wray was the principal speaker at the ceremony.

Training for the program is provided by the FBI Academy instructional staff, Special Agents, and other staff members holding advanced degrees, many of whom are recognized internationally in their fields of expertise.

Since 1972, National Academy students have been able to earn undergraduate and graduate credits from the University of Virginia due to the accreditation by the university of the many courses offered.

The graduating officers were represented by the class spokesperson, Lisa Drake, Port of Seattle Police Department, Seattle, Washington. A total of 51,519 graduates now represent the alumni of the FBI National Academy since it began in 1935.

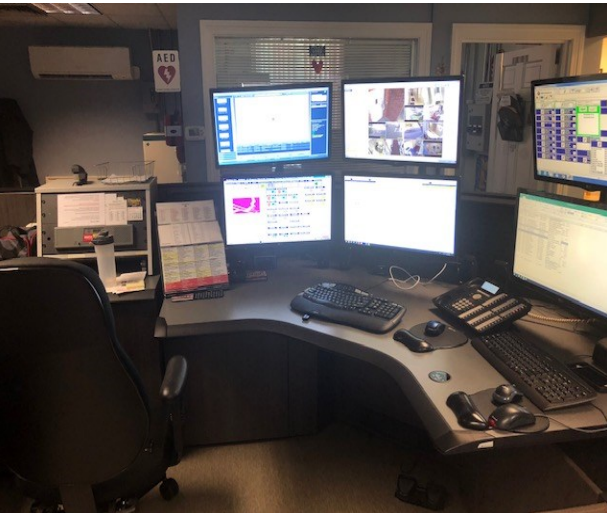

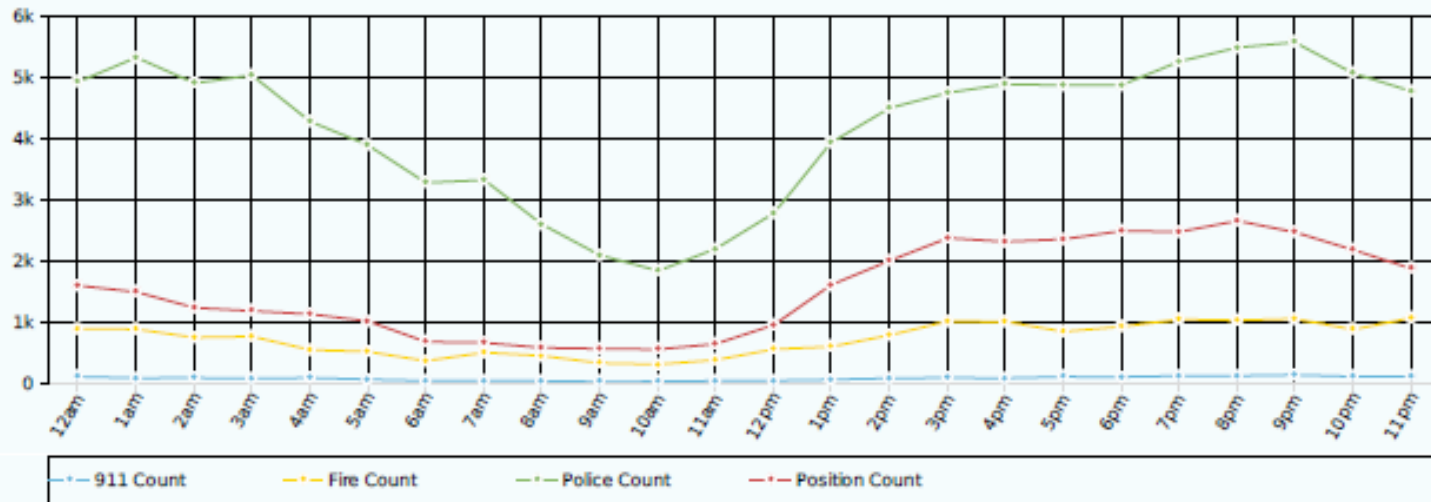
