## JANUARY 2011

Rochelle Hazardous Materials Technicians were called by DeKalb County MABAS Division Six for a hazardous materials spill at Custom Aluminum in Genoa. Crews responded, but not needed for operations at the scene. This type of mutual aid response will result in reimbursable costs paid by the "spiller". The city received reimbursement for the response.

### ***Retired Chief William F. Lower Dies***

In January, Rochelle Firefighters lost a good friend with the passing of Retired Fire Chief Bill Lower. Bill was very active during and after his years as a firefighter, attending fire department social functions right up until his death at age 95. On January 3rd, firefighters assembled an honor guard and used the antique engine, Old Gertie, to carry Bill to his graveside where he received the Firefighters Bell Service. ### ***Fire Dept. puts new ambulance in service***



The fire department takes possession of a new ambulance, a 2011 MedTec Type I on a Ford Super Duty chassis from Foster Coach Sales in Sterling. It replaces a 2005 Wheeled Coach ambulance that had a bad track record for reliability and service.

### ***91<sup>st</sup> Annual Firemen's Ball***

The Rochelle Fire Department Social Organization (RFDSO) continued a long tradition by holding its 91st Annual Fireman's Ball on January 22nd. It was held in the Stillman Room of the Hickory Grove Civic Center. An estimated 325 guests came to dance and enjoy a break from the cold weather. Though not truly "annual", as it was not held for two years during wartime, it can be traced back to the 1800's. It may be the longest running event in the community.

Funds raised by the ball support the service efforts of the Rochelle firefighters, including an annual Kishwaukee College scholarship, Rochelle Little League, Rochelle Junior Tackle, the Needy Family Food & Toy Drive, C.A.N. Children's Christmas Walk among others.



## **FEBRUARY 2011**

### ***Building Pre-Planning underway***

The fire department has begun contacting and visiting target hazards in the city, planning for any possible emergencies that may occur at that site. The planning includes maps, contact information and hazard lists. This month, pre-planning of the two nursing homes in Rochelle was completed.

### ***“The Oaks” is destroyed during blizzard***

Early on the morning of February 2<sup>nd</sup>, during one of the fiercest blizzards in recent history, Rochelle firefighters were called for structure fire at 420 S 7<sup>th</sup> Street. Upon arrival at the former Oaks Restaurant, crews found the rear of the building fully involved. The building was thought to be occupied, so firefighters mounted a full attack of the fire. Rochelle Police did account for all family members; no one was at the building this night. Response was severely hampered by the weather, only a few off duty firefighters were able to respond to help. Two additional personnel and Chief Johnson spent the night at the station, allowing for a seven personnel response if needed.

### ***Water Rescue skills learned***

On February 12<sup>th</sup>, ten Rochelle firefighters began a 32 hour Water Rescue Operations class. This is a certification recognized by the Illinois Office of the State Fire Marshal. This course centers around operations at an ice rescue, swift water or still water rescue/ recovery with the emphasis on safety. The Flagg-Rochelle Park District allowed the use of the indoor pool for this class, at no cost to the city.



### ***Ethanol Plant Emergency Planning***

On February 23<sup>rd</sup>, Chief Johnson, along with Steward Fire Chief Galen Cardott met with Illinois River Energy officials and reviewed their Emergency Plan. The meeting was wrapped up with a tour of the facility.

Each shift of Rochelle firefighters then toured the plant during the next month.



## **MARCH 2011**

### ***Rescue Boat goes into service***

The City of Rochelle entered a cooperative purchase with the Ogle-Lee Fire Protection District, buying a 16 foot rescue/recovery boat for use by both entities. The city and the district have within their boundaries, over 100 bodies of water. The fire department plans to preplan some of the quarries and stone pits for possible rescues or recoveries. The boat is equipped with a high definition sonar unit for searches and mapping capabilities. Ogle-Lee F.P.D. trustee Rick Kasmar helped design the boat and delivered the boat to the Rochelle Fire Department on March 2<sup>nd</sup>.



### ***Fire Department hosts Leadership Academy group***

The Rochelle Chamber of Commerce's Leadership Academy visited firefighters during their annual visit to city departments. The group was treated to some firehouse cuisine, dining in the fire department's basement.

### ***Johnson attends NFA***



During the week of March 19-26, Chief Johnson attended a Command and Control course at the National Fire Academy in Emmitsburg, Maryland. The course was geared towards large scale incidents and the method in coordinating mutual aid companies. Preplanning, target hazards, incident action plans and use of mutual aid personnel were discussed in the six day class. This course, as well as travel, is free through the Department of Homeland Security and FEMA.

## **APRIL 2011**

### ***"Station 2" goes into service***

Beginning April 4<sup>th</sup>, the fire department rented a building at 770 Wood Street, the former Hayes Cabinetry Building, to accommodate response to the south side of Rochelle during the period in which the Seventh Street overpass was closed. The fire department housed an engine and an ambulance with 2 personnel at "Station 2". At times, trains sit motionless or move very slowly, tying traffic up for long periods, many times up to 30 minutes. There were multiple confirmed calls where a train would have severely delayed response from Station 1 and were covered by "Station 2" duty personnel.

This period of two stations demonstrated the shortened response times to locations on the "southside", though with only two personnel. Personnel from both stations would respond to guarantee the quality of care and speed of service was maintained. The fire department budget took a hit with the unexpected delay in reopening the overpass and increased fuel usage.

### ***TLC/Ryder donates trailer***

On April 7, the fire department took possession of 32 foot enclosed trailer from the Ryder/TLC Company. The company had used this trailer as a hazardous materials response trailer dealing with, in particular,



ammonia events at their facility. The trailer was available for use at other cold storage facilities within Rochelle. The company had decided to donate it to the city as they were no longer staffing trained hazardous materials technicians. The trailer held two large ventilation fans, a number of "HazMat" entry suits and an onboard generator. The firefighters quickly began outfitting the trailer for our "HazMat" needs. The trailer will also be used as a remote Incident Command Post for any disaster or long incident. The fire department has already planned training at the Ryder facility, using the new acquisition.

### ***Insurance Services Office visits RFD***

On April 13<sup>th</sup>, Sandy Lykins, field representative for ISO, began his assessment of the fire department. The survey is completed approximately every 10-12 years, evaluating the city's ability to suppress and prevent fire loss to local structures.



On this day, he met with Kathy Cooper and Brad Richolson of the Water/Water Reclamation Department of RMU, Sandy Sullivan of the Rochelle Police Department and Chief Johnson for the first of many days of evaluating. As of the time of this report, the results of the survey have not been received.

### ***Ten medics become Tactical EMTs***

Beginning on April 16, ten firefighters attended a 5 day Tactic EMS Class. The course allows paramedics to accompany police personnel when doing special tactics operations. Studies have shown that if a "medic" is on scene when an officer is wounded, the outcome is much more positive. This is a cooperative effort between the Rochelle Police Department, Ogle County Sheriff's Department and the Rochelle Fire Department. The class was held at RFD and RTHS.



## ***Ogle-Lee FPD and City of Rochelle renew contract***

The Ogle-Lee Fire Protection District has again contracted ambulance, rescue and fire services from the City of Rochelle. The long running contract has been effect since the beginning of the district in 1973. The contract for fiscal year 2011-2012 will total approximately \$44765.00, down slightly from the previous year due to a drop in the district's Estimated Assessed Valuation (EAV).



### ***Chief Johnson attends Explosives Class***

On April 26<sup>th</sup>, in order to display fireworks for the annual Independence Day celebration, Chief Johnson attended an explosives class in Ottawa. This class is required to maintain the city's Pyrotechnics License with the Office of the State Fire Marshal.

### ***RFD attends MABAS Water Summit***

On May 4, Lt. Underwood and Chief Johnson attended a statewide MABAS (Mutual Aid Box Alarm System) Water Rescue Summit in Peoria. This summit was held to determine the need for state funded training for water rescue & recovery. The Rochelle firefighters joined representatives from 48 MABAS divisions, including Division 18 (Ogle County) and Division 6 (DeKalb County), in learning about and expressing their concerns about water emergency training.

MABAS (Mutual Aid Box Alarm System) in partnership with IEMA (Illinois Emergency Management Agency) have established a statewide, non-discriminatory mutual aid response system for fire, EMS and specialized incident operational teams. Sharing the effort are representatives from the Office of the State Fire Marshal, Department of Public Health - EMS Division and Illinois Fire Chiefs Association.



### ***FBC gives FD a training opportunity***

On May 9, Mike Pierce, of FBC, Inc., offered and delivered a large poly storage tank from his plant to firefighters for training purposes. The tank was thoroughly cleaned and brought to the temporary fire location at Wood Street. Firefighters used the tank for confined space rescue practice.

### ***City and Firefighters begin negotiations***

City officials and members of Rochelle Firefighters Association, Local 3445, met to begin contract negotiations. The current contract expires on April 30, 2011. At the time of this report, no contract has been reached.

***Fire & Police worked to solve crime***

On May 12<sup>th</sup>, fire crews assisted police detectives John Kaltenbach and Terry Inman in a search for a gun that may have been disposed of in the Kyte River, near Treatment Plant Road. Three firefighters searched an approximate 100 foot section of the creek bottom by hand and with metal detectors for approximately 90 minutes with no results.

***Fire Safety at Lincoln Manor***

FF Zach Prewett hosted a fire safety “talk” with residents at the Lincoln Manor apartments, following an evacuation drill. FF Prewett stressed the importance of early notification of an emergency, sheltering in-place during a fire alarm along with other safety tips. The session was well-received by the residents at the complex.

***The circus comes to town, briefly***

On June 1, fire personnel from Rochelle Fire and Ogle-Lee Fire volunteered to meet the Ringling Brothers/Barnum and Bailey Circus Train at Global III Intermodal Hub to supply water for the circus animals and for cleaning. The train crews were very pleased with the fire department’s help and stated that they would stop in Rochelle again next year. The circus was traveling from Chicago to Omaha, Nebraska.



***Two firefighters become paramedics***

Full-time firefighter Jody Willis and paid-on-call firefighter Tyler Carls completed EMT-Paramedic training and successfully challenged the state exam. FF Willis scored one of Rochelle Fire’s highest state test scores. The department now boasts 14 paramedics.



## ***Fire stopped in Short Court apartment***

At 4:26 p.m. on June 26, firefighters responded to a working apartment fire at 1255 Short Court. Crews entered the building, evacuating all the residents in the first few minutes. Shortly after the evacuation, the fire-involved apartment was entered and the fire was contained to the room of origin. The source was narrowed to a malfunctioning refrigerator compressor motor, igniting a paper bag of recyclables stacked against it in the kitchen area. The loss of the property and contents was estimated at \$5000.00.

## ***Firefighters Carls and Lewis deployed to Georgia***

In June 2011 Tyler Carls and Josh Lewis were deployed to Georgia on a wildland firefighting assignment as part of TGF Forestry and Fire based out of Libertyville, IL. They were deployed to the Okefenokee National Wildlife Refuge in Southern Georgia in late June. They were deployed from June 24<sup>th</sup> thru July 1<sup>st</sup>. During their deployment they worked 16 hour shifts on a wildland fire engine protecting structures and patrolling for fire extension. The firefighters took vacation time to complete this assignment.



## **July 2011**

## ***Annual Fireworks Display***

As in so many years past, the Rochelle firefighters organized, set-up and “shot” the fireworks display for the annual Fourth of July celebration. Over 200 people-hours of work were performed in order to bring the show to the park. Weather conditions were great and the show went off with no problems. Atwood Park and the surrounding area were filled with residents enjoying the show.



## ***Fire Assists Police with Drowning***



On July 15, Rochelle Police called firefighters to the quarry at Flagg Road for a report of a possible drowned man. The agencies worked together to assess the patient’s status and recover the individual. Rochelle detectives and the Illinois State Police investigated the incident.

### ***RFD and RCH team up to host Mock Vehicle Accident***



On July 16<sup>th</sup>, the Emergency Department of Rochelle Community Hospital, the Ogle County Coroner's Office, Lifeline Helicopter of OSF St. Anthony's, Rochelle Police and the Rochelle Fire teamed up to bring a safety message to the public. A mock accident "occurred" at Helms Field, the result of a young woman texting while driving. There were multiple victims, with one "fatality". A very moving speech was given to the crowd of attendees by a mother of a teen killed while the teen was texting to conclude the presentation. This presentation is planned again for some time in 2012.

### ***Byron Nuclear Plant Drill at RCH***

Chief Johnson participated in the Exelon Nuclear Plant emergency drill at the Ogle County Emergency Operations Center in the basement of Rochelle Community Hospital. Representatives from area cities, police agencies, fire districts and county agencies gathered to simulate an "incident" at the generation plant. Johnson assumed the fire department representative in this simulation.



### ***HazMat Techs go to Genoa, again***

On July 25<sup>th</sup>, Rochelle Fire was called for a Hazardous Materials response as part of MABAS Division 6 team to a residence on Genoa. The scene was a single family home where chlorine was possibly mixed with another agent, causing an explosion. Seven "hazmat" technicians and 1 operations personnel responded with the HazMat trailer. Entry was made, clearing the chemical, decontamination accomplished and clean up finished in good time. Chief Bruce Kozlowski, Genoa-Kingston Fire, gave a debriefing and we were released.

## **August 2011**

### ***Johnson attends exercise***

On August 4<sup>th</sup>, Chief Johnson attended a tabletop exercise at the BP Terminal in Rochelle. The exercise was attended by workers at BP and their regional safety manager. The scenario included a spill at the facility and what would be done on site to mitigate the exposure to the community. After the tabletop, a tour was taken of the entire plant, with emphasis on the drainage shutdown system.



### ***Watercraft Technician Class held here***

Rochelle and Ogle-Lee fire agencies hosted a Watercraft Technician class for area first responders on August 6th. The class demonstrates the safe use of boats in emergency situations involving rescue personnel. This class is recognized by the Office of the State Fire Marshal.

### ***Lincoln Highway Heritage Festival***

The fire department were busy during the LHHF in August, selling their pork chop sandwiches, participating in the parade and lending Chief Johnson out as one of an elite judging trio, along with Chief Higby and Mayor Olson, for the “Rochelle’s Got Talent” contest.



### **September 2011**

### ***Firefighters Fill-The-Boot for MDA***

On Labor Day, September 5, Rochelle firefighters, family and friends took to the streets and collected for the Annual Muscular Dystrophy Telethon. If a resident gave 5\$ or more, he or she was treated to a pork chop sandwich, courtesy of the Rochelle Fire Department Social Organization. A total of \$2450.00 was raised in approximately five hours. This event was chaired by FF Brian Edwards.



### ***RFD pays quiet tribute***



In tribute to all the victims of the September 11, 2001 attacks at the World Trade Center, the Rochelle firefighters displayed their large American Flag at Lake Sule in hopes those traveling by Rochelle on the two interstates, as well as local residents, would remember and reflect on this tenth anniversary. Throughout the afternoon, family and friends visited at the lake.

### ***RTHS remembers 9/11***

Members of the Rochelle and Ogle-Lee Fire Departments were invited to join other area representatives and students at a flag-raising at Rochelle Township High School to commemorate the tenth anniversary of the September 11<sup>th</sup> attacks. On September 12<sup>th</sup>, local police, fire, city, county and state officials were on hand, as well as all RTHS students and faculty. Approximately 30 firefighters attended.



### ***Medics teach L.O.T.S. drivers First Aid***

Drivers for the Lee-Ogle Transportation System and the Hub City Senior Center attended a short seminar at the fire department discussing emergency first aid on September 21st. Seven drivers attended and were taught what the initial steps in caring for a passenger having a medical emergency or during an accident involving their vehicle.



### ***Lt. Schaefer Retires from RFD***

After more than 26 years as a career firefighter for the fire department, Lt. Adlai Schaefer retires. Adlai began his full-time career in June of 1985, after serving as the volunteer fire chief for the Lee Fire Protection District. Adlai farmed in the Lee area prior to moving to Rochelle. He is married to Teri and has two sons, Zach and Tyler. We wish Adlai the best of health in the future.



### ***FF Miller named as Lieutenant***

On September 26, FF Dan Miller was promoted to the position of Fire Lieutenant. Dan has held the top spot on the lieutenant's eligibility list after testing was held in 2010.

Lt. Miller has served as a full-time firefighter since October of 1995, after a nine year stint as a Paid-On-Call firefighter for RFD. Prior to moving to Rochelle in 1986, he volunteered for the Leaf River Fire Protection District in his hometown.

Dan is a Certified Fire Officer II and Certified Paramedic and has "hit the ground running" in his new position.



### ***Johnson named fulltime firefighter***



Also on September 26, Benjamin Johnson began his career as fulltime firefighter for the fire department. Ben has served as a Paid-On-Call firefighter since graduating RTHS in June 2005.

Ben comes on as an Illinois Certified Firefighter II, Illinois Certified Paramedic and PADI Rescue Diver. Ben will serve under Lt. Miller.

## ***October 2011***

### ***Firefighter Fore goes to DeKalb Fire***

On October 7<sup>th</sup>, firefighter Jason Fore ended his full-time career with Rochelle and began a new one with the DeKalb Fire Department. He began in 2004 after serving as Paid-On-Call firefighter for Rochelle and Ogle-Lee in Hillcrest. While at Rochelle, he performed his duties as firefighter and paramedic at a very high level. We wish the best for Jason in his future endeavors.



## ***Adamson named fulltime firefighter***



On October 10<sup>th</sup>, Todd Adamson returned to Rochelle Fire as the newest full-time firefighter. Todd had served as a Paid-On-Call firefighter for RFD, but had left for a couple of years, while working for Lifeline Ambulance in Rockford. Todd comes in with his Certified Firefighter II and Paramedic status. He is married to Tiffany and lives in DeKalb.

## ***Fire Prevention Week begins***

The fire station became a busy place during the month of October, playing host to over 450 children, from ages 3 to 10 years, learning fire safety from the Rochelle firefighters. Each year, the week in which October 9<sup>th</sup> falls is designated Fire Prevention Week. Mayor Olson proclaimed the week of October 9-15 as “Fire Prevention Week in Rochelle” and the schools began scheduling tours at the station and firefighter visits to the classrooms. ## ***Rochelle Firefighters assists Tiskilwa Fire after Train Derailment***

On October 8<sup>th</sup>, four Rochelle firefighters and one Ogle-Lee firefighter were deployed to Tiskilwa, just south of Princeton, to assist in a large-scale train derailment. The accident, which occurred early on Friday, October 7<sup>th</sup>, derailed 26 cars, some of which were carrying ethanol, on the Iowa Interstate Railroad-operated train at about 2 a.m., just east of Tiskilwa. Five ethanol tank cars had ignited and burned throughout the following day.

The Rochelle crew, including Chief Johnson, was deployed to serve as a Rapid Intervention Team during the off-loading of the remaining ethanol. They assisted in “laying foam” for safe off-loading. They were on scene for 12 hours. This was done through our mutual aid agreements.



## November 2011

### ***Firefighters hold Pork Chop Drive-Thru for C.A.N. Children's Christmas Walk***



On November 16<sup>th</sup>, Rochelle firefighters and families helped members of the Rochelle Golden K, Wal-Mart and the Community Action Network raise funds to sponsor the annual Children's Christmas Walk. A pork chop drive-thru dinner was held at the Fireman' Social Hall and it was one of the most successful yet. Over \$2200.00 profit was raised in the four hours to be used for the charity.

### ***Testing for FF Eligibility List Held***

With the firefighter eligibility list due to expire at the end of December, 2011, testing for a new two list was held on the morning of November 19<sup>th</sup> at the fire station. Thirty application packets were given out during the advertising period with ten being returned in time. The written exam was administered first, yielding only one remaining candidate. Due to new state legislation effective August 1<sup>st</sup> of this year, the scoring of the written test resulted with a failing score being anything below 87%. As a result, only one of the ten candidates scored above 87% and was eligible to complete the physical portion of the exam. He successfully completed the physical test and oral interview and a list of one candidate was created.

The new law states that after completion of the written tests, the average score of all tests shall be calculated. The passing score is the average score plus 10% of the average score. In our case, the average was 79% with the resulting cut-off being 79 plus 7.9, or 86.9%. It is quite possible for a group of test results to result in no passing scores, no matter how high or low the scores.

Chief Johnson contacted Representative Bob Pritchard and explained the obvious downfall of the new law. Mr. Pritchard stated that we were not the only concerned agency and that new legislation may likely follow. Lt. Underwood contacted the legal counsel for Rochelle's Fire and Police commission and he echoed Mr. Pritchard's prediction.

## December 2011



### *Gertie still "parading around"*

RFD's pride and joy, Engine 1, or "Ol' Gertie" as she is better known, again graced every parade held in Rochelle this year. Beginning with Memorial Day, she participated in parades during Independence Day, the Lincoln Highway Heritage Festival and the RTHS Homecoming. ### *Hybrid Vehicle Technology Taught*

Members of the Rochelle & Ogle-Lee departments attended a two-hour seminar on the construction of hybrid and electric vehicles. The training was hosted by Sawicki Motor Company and the Universal Technical Institute of Chicago at Sawicki's Collision Center. This course was free of charge and first of this type in this area. Firefighters from outside our districts also attended.



### *Needy Families Food & Toy Drive*

The fire department again hosted this drive, accepting and storing donations for this group. On December 22, Ogle-Lee firefighters delivered Christmas boxes to families in the rural areas. Students from RTHS gathered at the fire station on the morning of Christmas Eve and delivered boxes to the families in Rochelle. Before delivering, Rochelle firefighters, family and friends prepared and hosted a breakfast at the Fireman's Social Hall for the students. This has been a long standing tradition that puts an exclamation point on the Christmas season.

### **Total Responses: 1796**

The total responses are up 4% from 2010, despite the fact the fire department suspended out-of-town patient transfers during the period in which the overpass was closed for repairs. (Those months are marked above \*). A patient transfer is when a patient is moved from Rochelle Community Hospital to another healthcare facility for various reasons. If the current average of 32 transfers per month held true through those months, our ambulance responses would have gone up by 11%.

Total loss to structure fires this year was \$118,030.00. Due to the work of the fire department, over \$1,970,000.00 in structures were saved. The largest loss came from the fire on February 2nd at 420 South 7<sup>th</sup> Street ("the Oaks"). Total loss in vehicle fires came to \$108,000.00, with one tractor-trailer unit driving up the totals.

For the majority of responses during the overpass closure period two vehicles were utilized to ensure the same level of service prior to the closure. That and the increase in fuel prices are causing the fuel budget to be exceeded this fiscal year.

During the course of the year, Rochelle fire personnel have racked up over 3000 hours of continuing education hours. These hours consist of required hours for EMT certification, refresher hours for fire & rescue training, firefighter safety and water and dive rescue training.

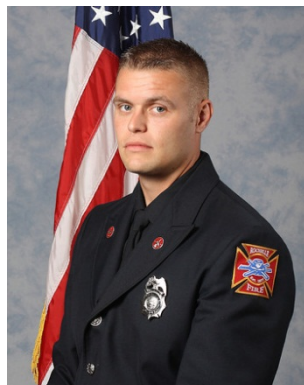
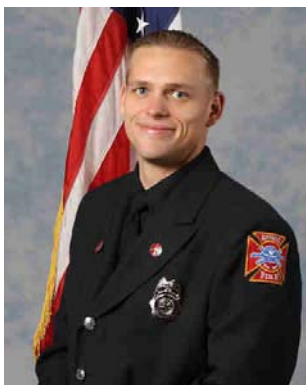
