WHEREAS, founded by suffragist Carrie Chapman Catt, the League was charged with "finish[ing] the fight to ensure that every eligible voter has free and fair access to the polls. Ever since, the League has been at the forefront of efforts to empower citizens to play an active role in our democracy;
