16 calls for assistance

Maintaining a locked and secured building.

Supervision before and after school as well as during lunch.

Talk to students that have been in trouble or are making poor choices about the potential long term consequences if they continue the poor behavior.

Instruct and review with students and staff our ALICE training.

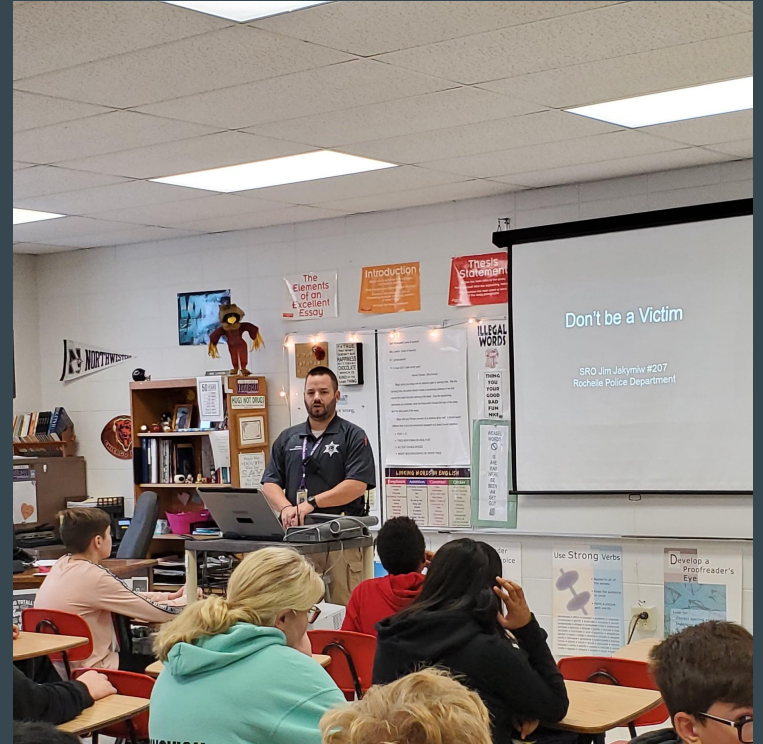
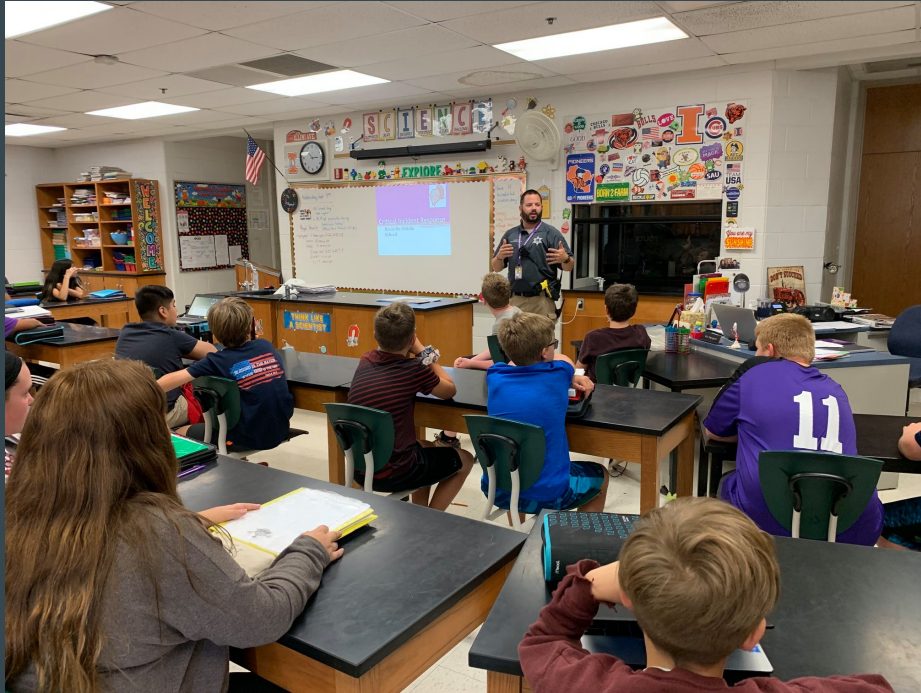
Working with the district to obtain devices to secure doors easier during an emergency and getting room numbers on the exterior windows for easier identification for LE in an emergency.

With each new school year brings new adventures.

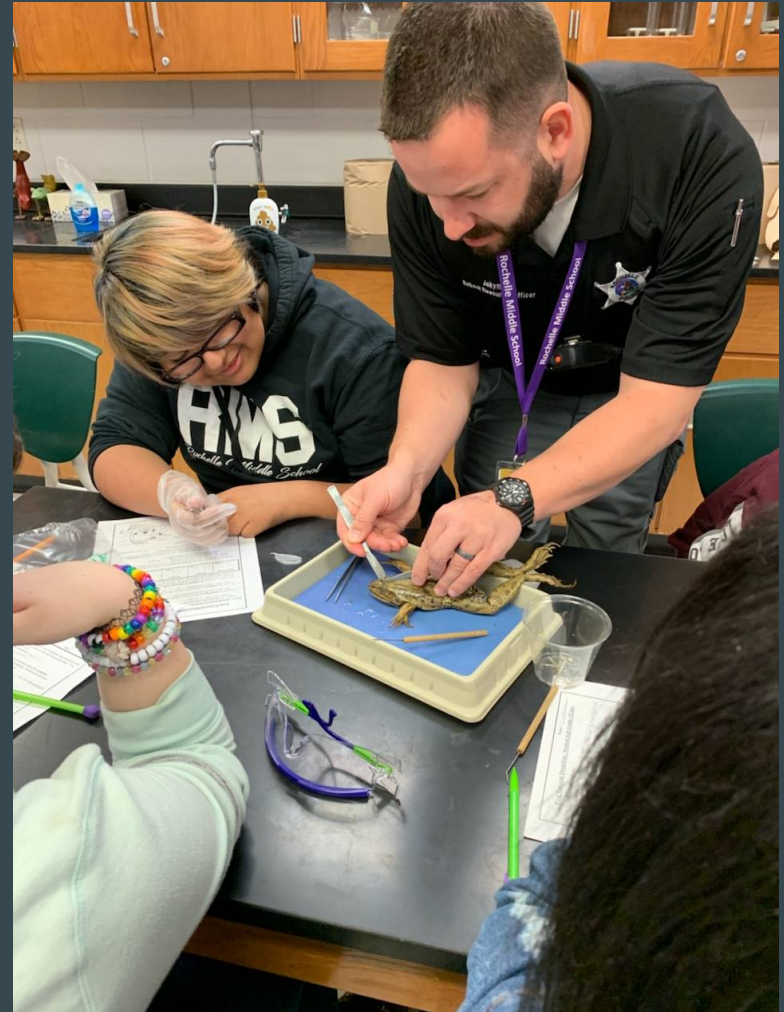
- I'm sure any parent would agree that a lot changes in a short amount of time for our middle school students.

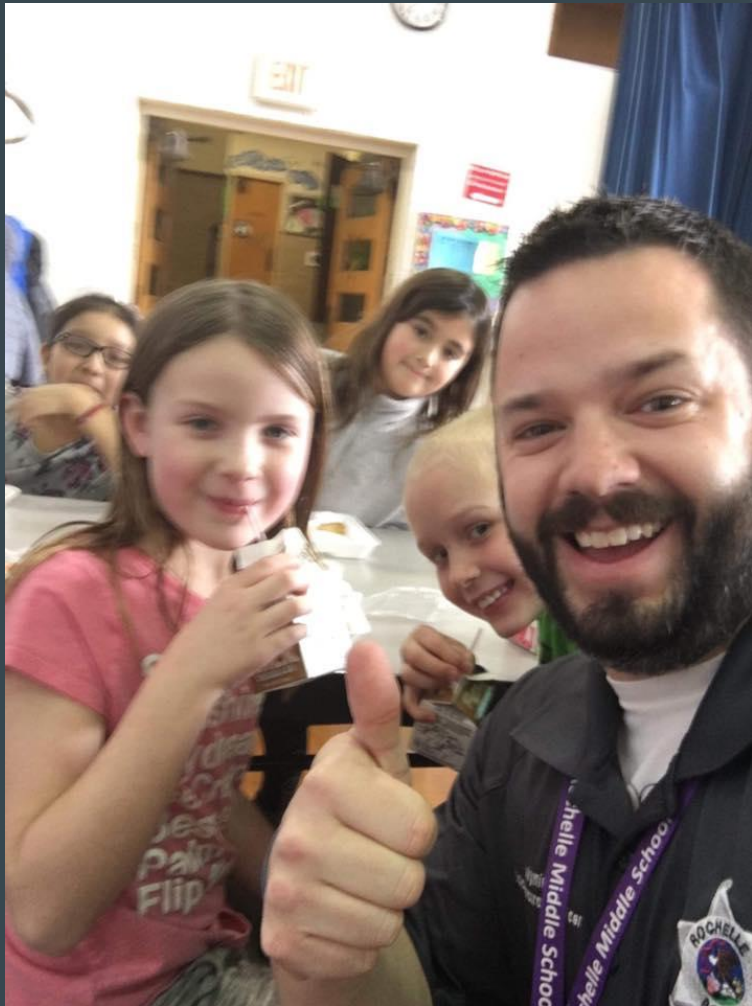
